The President Claire Blackford spoke about people who are talking and to listen to them and not to interrupt them, everyone will have any opportunity to speak. Andrew O'Neill handed out the above spreadsheet showing the difference of what the ranking average groupings are at present compared to what Tom Gill is proposing. Claire Blackford then handed the floor over to Tom Gill to conduct the special business received.

Tom Gill spoke about giving back to the game and he said that he hoped the league would be strong enough to get back to divisions and hopefully the more experience players will couple with those players wanting to learn, grow and develop their game. Having said that some of the more experienced players seem to be discouraged from playing with many reasons for that, a number of people have become disillusioned with it but what I'm trying to do is create an environment where we all can come in and develop and try and get strong players in the teams to build the skill base back up again.

Tom Gill then explained his proposal of 20% across all five groupings saying that it was statically even across the board making it fairer for everyone. He provided an explanation with sheets of data for everyone to look at showing statically the gap difference between the groups presently and how uneven it is compared to what he is proposing of an even 20% between all groups again making it fairer for everyone.

The floor was opened up for questions with many people commenting on the proposal.

Lots of people commenting on how they think that the top players have no interest in spreading out to other teams and helping out other less experience players citing many of the comments on 'Pool Buddies'.

Wayne van Heerewaarden commented on the how the spread will be only across the three middle groups with only a few in the top and bottom groups, also the difference of players ability across each of the middle groups was huge.

People thought that the system was working with the amount of competition in the Summer Competition with players who have been around for 20+ years suggesting the this was the most competitive season to date, teams were missing out on percentage not games.

Belinda Burke said that people call our team a stacked team but with the two newer lower group players in the team this season and even when our one's and our lower player pull their weight, we still can't win the night. Andrew O'Neill said that that's because of the side you've got, it's a numbers game and you guys are still fairly low in points.

People thanked Tom Gill for his time and effort and noted that he has been helping out players with their game. Claire Blackford thanked Tom Gill for not just sitting back and complaining about an issue but put in the effort and put forward a proposal. Claire Blackford spoke about her concern for the proposal as it would dramatically change the handicap system and how it will benefit just the top players and disadvantage the rest of the league. I'm also concerned about the attitude of some of those top players, we want not just the top players to come back we want <u>all</u> players to come back, we have lost a lot of members.

1. President's Report:

I would also like to thank Matt for his commitment to the league this last year as he is stepping down from his role on the Committee. I believe it's important to thank the Committee publicly because often members don't know how much work is involved behind the scenes in running the league and these people have done so without complaint and have been a great Committee to work with.

We've come to the end of another summer comp season and I'm happy to say it was another successful season, even though it was a shorter season of 11 rounds it still felt like a decent season. Congratulations to the Sharp Shooters for taking out the gf and congratulations to The Postmen for taking out the winter comp gf. The last 3 seasons have seen different teams have the opportunity to play finals and 3 different teams win the gf so it shows the handicap system works well, in that it gives all teams the opportunity to be competitive and push themselves through finals to get the win. The handicaps didn't play a huge part during finals as there were minimal or no frames exchanged during finals matches but the ladder throughout the summer comp showed how competitive the field was during the season. Again, congratulations to those teams who stepped up during the finals and played their best to get the win.

2. Vice President's Report:

Matt Anderson said that we really need to give some serious thought to IR and I'll leave it at that.

3. Treasurer's Report:

3.1 Dean Burridge passed around the annual statement to the members.

We completed Winter and Summer seasons with one division and with the handicap system, which will be under review at our AGM. Team numbers were much the same as the previous year. The Association had a small deficit of \$987.48 for the reporting year. Additionally, the junior

account funds are \$222.23 lower as we allocated money to an eligible person this year, for the first time in several seasons.

The loss on operating is attributable to

- (1) The carry over cost of trophies for the previous Summer Competition,
- (2) Not receiving payment from the Morwell RSL for the last part of the Summer Competition before the end of the reporting period, and
- (3) The purchase of insurance for the Bunnings BBQ which did not go ahead.
- 3.2 Our publicity officer Rosa Payne did a great job finding \$1,500 in sponsorship from Melina Bath MP, Turks Bar and Morwell RSL, which has added considerably to the financial result.
- 3.3 Thank you to the team captains for the payment of fees. Most of this was done without prompting, and all fees were paid on time, which makes my role much easier.
- 3.4 The Committee has continued to be responsible and conservative in our spending this season, and has provided an even result for the past year. It is hoped the coming season will be similar.
 - **Business Arising:**
- 3.5 Dylan Goodwin enquired about the public liability insurance and is it a policy that will be kept in place long term.
 - Dean Burridge said that we plan on doing at least one or two of the Bunnings bbq as they are supposed to be very profitable. We have Traralgon Bunnings lined up but to do so you must have public liability insurance and that will last twelve months.
 - Claire Blackford said that we will try it this year and we will see if it's beneficial or not. The cost of the insurance \$472.84.
- 3.6 Suzanne Allan asked what is the plan with the extra money that we are getting are we doing anything with it?
 - Dean Burridge said not at this stage but sponsorship is never guaranteed, for example sponsorship from venues who knows if they are able to provide sponsorship in the future. We have expenditures like country cup entries and payments to go away as well as shirts. We have started doing individual payments again.
 - Claire Blackford noted that sponsorship has become more challenging for businesses so we are looking at other ways of income.
- 3.7 Daniel Tabone asked about the purpose of having \$19,000 in the bank?

 We do have expenses throughout the season we are also helping out with the Mick Hill exhibition match. We have had some unusual things happen the last few years like covid so the Country Cup didn't go ahead one year and so we were in credit.
- 3.8 Daniel Tabone enquired about having a presentation night again. There are that many places to go out for the night, it would be good to have a night out again with the members and their partners. Andrew O'Neill said that he believed the Premiere Room is open again but there are other venues.

Dean Burridge said that we can look at that again and cost, there are a few venues around that we can use.

Special Business:

1. Pool Victoria Delegates Report:

I attended the Pool Vic AGM in January, there have been no changes to our affiliation fee for this coming year. 17 leagues are currently affiliated with Pool Vic as opposed to 18 last year. Over 50% of these leagues have changed over to International Rules and the remaining leagues are still playing World Rules. There is no deadline or pressure from Pool Vic for us to change to IR, they state we are to run our league how we see fit, and they will not dictate how we run our league.

2. International Rules & World 8 Ball Rules:

Claire Blackford said that obversley will need to change over to IR there's no avoiding it all the leagues are changing soon, we will have Country Cup, Gippy Cup all of those sorts of tournaments so there's no reason to stay with world rules, so basically the decision is when do we do it? So, we want to start Winter Comp in one week so in our minds it's too quick to go to IR to start winter. Peoples are not prepared as there are a lot of players who have not played it before, there are players here who have played IR and want to start it straight away. I understand that, but I don't see the rush and we would propose that we start playing IR in the Summer Comp as it will give people more opportunity to look up the Utube videos, read the rules and learn the new game. It will also give us an opportunity to run some exhibition matches with some of the players and run a few social comps during the Winter Competition or in-between seasons. It will give members more time to prepare for the players who have never played it and have no idea what the difference is. So that's what we are proposing that we start IR in the Summer Competition.

Many members spoke in favour of going to IR now and not waiting till the Summer Competition as the new rules have been out now for over twelve months.

Mick Lubawski raised the concern about umpiring with many people not knowing the rules.

Angela Dean was concerned that she will not know the rules and either will her other team players with the comp starting only one weeks away.

It was also noted that there was only a small set of rules to learn and to learn the basics of the games does not take very long, it will only take a few games.

Andrew O'Neill stated that the Country Cup this year is World Rules but next year the thought is that it will change to IR.

Claire Blackford moved the floor to vote on Winter or Summer to start IR.

Winter: 16 Summer: 10

The International Rules will be played in the Winter Competition starting next week.

Claire Blackford said that we will do what Wonthaggi have done and do an open rule for the first half of

the season and we will do sixty seconds shot clock for the season.

3. Country Cup: Wonthaggi 2024 & LV8BA 2024:

The Latrobe Valley Eight Ball Association will be hosting the Country Cup this year and it will be held in Sale at the Gippsland Regional Sports Complex on the last weekend in May the 25th & 26th and runs over three days. Friday night they have a knockout comp with Saturday and Sunday the main comp and finals. Claire Blackford went onto say that next week she will put out on the Facebook page asking for any players interested in representing the LV8BA you may also message me as well.

Jamee van Gelderen asked what are the requirements to play in the Country Cup this year? Andrew O'Neill responded saying that they have changed some of the By-Laws recently I think it's fifty percent (50%).

Jamee van Gelderen asked is that for our Winter Comp last year? Yes.

Andrew O'Neill also stated that now that the formats are the same for both Winter and Summer Competitions, we need to amend this in our by-laws to reflect this. Andrew O'Neill read out the by-law for everyone.

Claire Blackford said we will have at least two team but hopefully three.

4. Winter Competition Groupings:

The groupings have been done and are up on the website and are on those A3 sheets that I handed out earlier. There weren't that many changes but we have quite a few new groupings to do with teams having new players and we will update the list going forward.

5. Teams Winter 2024:

We will have twelve teams and will be doing a twenty-two round draw and we will be starting next Tuesday.

6. Scorebooks:

Andrew O'Neill said that he will try and get the scorebooks out to you to the venue on the night of your first round, the draw will be on the website and Facebook. The A4 books that are behind the bar at the two venues will be updated with blank scorecards at the back in case we are unable to get the books ready.

7. Calendar Year: Start Date, Rounds & Finals.

Andrew O'Neill said that we all know we are starting next week and the comp will run into October with the grand final being on the 8^{th} October. It will be another long season but hopefully we will have more time for the Summer Competition.

Claire Blackford made a note to all teams as there have been issues in the past so when the draw comes out, please take note of the dates for the presentation, finals and the events.

8. Personal Space:

I want to discuss some issues around behaviour of some members. There have been a few instances in this last year of players cracking it during play, smacking their cue against the wall or on the floor, cracking their cue to pack it up because they expect to lose. I understand this is mostly out of frustration with your own game, having missed a shot or whatever but it has become a little bit too frequent and there have been times where players have come close to being penalised in a game as a result of this behaviour, including loss of frame.

9. Behaviour towards Committee Members:

The other issue that has come up this last year is members behaviour towards Committee members, talking in an inappropriate or aggressive manner towards them. This is not on. As you know the Committee members take time out of their lives to run the league for the members and should not have to put up with that behaviour regardless of what you think of that person or whether you agree with them. I'll be instructing all Committee members to walk away from anyone who is inappropriate in any way towards them, so if you want to be heard you might want to consider how you're going to approach the Committee member before you do so.

Just remember that every time there is an issue the Committee need to deal with, it takes additional time away from their personal lives, so just think about whether your issue is something that impacts on the league itself or does it just impact on you. Is it going to benefit the league to raise the issue or do you just want to vent some frustration or make a comment. Because if you have something to say that isn't going to benefit the majority of the league, don't say it. And just remember the Code of Conduct policy, which states:

Latrobe Valley Eight Ball Association opposes all forms of harassment, discrimination, and bullying. This includes treating or proposing to treat someone less favourably because of a particular characteristic; imposing or intending to impose an unreasonable requirement, condition or practice which has an unequal or disproportionate effect on people with a particular characteristic; or any behaviour that is offensive, abusive, belittling, intimidating, or threatening - whether this is face-to-face, indirectly, or via communication technologies such as mobile phones and computers.

Belinda Burke noted about players making comments before the game when you go to shake their hand, please refrain from making silly and negative comments as it's not helpful.

2nd Special General Meeting (Disciplinary Appeal Meeting) of the Latrobe Valley 8 Ball Association is to be held on Thursday the 11th July, 2024 7PM.

Meeting opened by President Claire Blackford at 7:08pm, Claire welcomed everyone to the Latrobe Valley Eight Ball Association's Special General Appeals Meeting.

This meeting is about disciplinary action the Committee has taken against Rick Merlo, and we're required to follow the rules set out in the Constitution sections 48-53 when taking disciplinary action against a member of our league.

The Committee made a resolution as part of the disciplinary action against Rick, which is basically a decision about a penalty, this resolution is detailed in section 5 of the agenda for this meeting. Rick has appealed this resolution, and we are required to convene this meeting for the members to vote on whether to uphold the resolution or revoke it. So it is now up to all of you to vote on whether to uphold the resolution made by the Committee or revoke it.

The process of the meeting is detailed in Constitution rule 53. Conduct of Disciplinary Appeal Meeting. Firstly, I will give you the background information as to why the Committee has taken this action and the reasons for passing the resolution, then Rick or his representative will have the opportunity to be heard, then you all are able to ask any questions to clarify anything, and then you will need to vote by secret ballot. If less than 75% of the members present at this meeting do not vote 'yes' in support of the resolution, then it is revoked. So, if you vote 'yes' you are supporting the Committee's resolution, if you vote 'no' you are not supporting the Committee's resolution and it will be revoked.

 Disciplinary Appeal – Rick Merlo

Claire presented to the members the following:

Background to the resolution: this all started at the Junior National Eight Ball Championships in January this year. Trey was selected to compete in the Junior National Titles and the league, as well as individual members of the league supported Trey and the family to go to Canberra for him to compete. The league gave financial support in good faith and I'm sure the members did the same.

During the Nationals there was a concern about Trey's behaviour, Pool Victoria and the AEBF took action during the Nationals in response. I'm not going to go into detail about that, but I mention it to give context. Trey was stood down from the Nationals for a period of time, after which Rick approached the two officials who were volunteering as the Team Managers of the Junior team, and it is reported that Rick's behavior towards them was abusive and threatening.

Rick contacted me during the Nationals to tell me what had happened with Trey, and to tell me that Pool Victoria had not followed proper procedure in this matter but did not mention the incident between himself and the volunteers. I was informed by a member of our league after the Nationals were over about what had occurred with Rick. I contacted Pool Victoria who confirmed there was an incident between Rick and the volunteers, and a formal complaint had been received about Rick's behavior. They advised that Rick approached the volunteers, was verbally abusive towards them, was swearing and they felt threatened by his behavior. Pool Victoria expressed their intention to follow up the formal complaint.

I then spoke to Rick and asked him about the incident, he acknowledged the incident but said he would never have done so if they had followed proper procedure. I said, "are you telling me that abusing volunteer officials is okay because they did the wrong thing?" Rick somewhat acknowledged what I was saying and then put to me that as a parent I would have done the same thing if something like that had happened with one of my children. I said I would never abuse officials like that, and it is never okay to justify abusive behaviour based on someone else's actions. Rick said he had apologised to the volunteers the next day and they accepted his apology.

Some weeks later I was contacted by Pool Victoria, asking for Rick's email address. They said they had been in communication with him about Trey and his behaviour at the Nationals but when they started talking about disciplinary action, Rick was no longer answering their calls. They needed his email address so they could arrange a disciplinary hearing and send notice of this meeting.

I received correspondence from Pool Victoria after their disciplinary meeting was held with the outcome. Rick was suspended for 12 months from all Pool Victoria events, backdated to the date of the incident at the Nationals; he was also given a suspended sentence for a period of 16 months, which would follow the suspension. It was stated that if any issues occurred during the suspended sentence Rick would face another full 12 month suspension. This decision was made under Pool Victoria's Prevention and Management of Occupational Violence and Aggression policy.

LVEBA's Committee then held a meeting and made a decision to take disciplinary action against Rick, as we found him to be guilty of conduct unbecoming a member of our Association. We made the following resolution:

- Suspension of membership from the LVEBA for a period of 18months, after which time Rick could re-apply for membership;
- A suspended sentence of a further 12 months, following the 18 month suspension of membership;
- ➤ Ineligibility for league representation for 36 months.

Rick was invited to address the Committee at a meeting regarding the resolution, which he did with his representative, Wayne Van Heerewaarden. Rick was given the opportunity to respond to the resolution. During this meeting Rick focused on the issue of Pool Victoria not following proper procedure and expressed that he felt this was a witch hunt. Rick again stated he had apologised to the volunteers the day after the incident, they accepted his apology and said they understood his actions were out of concern for Trey. Rick stated the volunteers had a smirk on their face when he apologised so feels they had an agenda (this was not something that Rick had mentioned previously). The incident was then described as a misunderstanding. We made it clear to Rick this is a serious matter, that his behavior is unacceptable and it is never okay to be abusive towards any officials or member of an Association.

Rick asked for the resolution to be reduced, and was asked to leave the meeting so the Committee could deliberate. The Committee then decided on the following resolution (which is the resolution to be decided on at this meeting):

- ➤ The Committee has by resolution suspended Rick Merlo from playing in the LVEBA for 8 months (for the remainder of the current Winter season and the upcoming Summer season of 2024/25);
- Rick will be eligible for membership renewal as of the 2025 AGM;
- ➤ A 12 month suspended sentence will be imposed following the suspension period. Any further issues relating to Rick's behaviour during the suspended sentence will result in a 12 month suspension of membership from the LVEBA;
- ➤ Rick will be ineligible for LVEBA representation for 3 years from Country Cup and Interleague;
- Rick will be ineligible for State Selection until January 2025.

Rick returned to the meeting and was informed of the decision. Rick then immediately appealed the decision, which has led to this meeting being called.

The only other information I want to add is information I have received directly from one of the volunteers involved in the incident. She was invited to attend this meeting however does not have transport and lives in the Melbourne area. She was happy to give her account of the incident for me to present at this meeting.

On day 3 of the State Junior Nationals Titles in January 2024, Trey was stood down from the Nationals due to concerns about his behaviour. The 2 officials who volunteered as Team Managers for the junior team met with Trey's family about the concerns. Rick presented as angry during the conversation and was asked by Trey to calm down. Rick did not know at that time the reasons why Trey had been stood down and was unaware of what had occurred.

Later that day, Rick approached the volunteers who were walking together at the time, leaving the venue. Rick wanted to talk to them about Trey being stood down, she described that he charged across the road to speak to them. Rick was very aggressive in his manner, his voice was raised, he was swearing and was standing in the personal space of the volunteers. They took a step back from him but he stepped closer, and was in their personal space throughout the incident. One of the volunteers asked Rick to watch his language a few times during the incident however Rick continued to swear with his voice raised. The volunteers felt Rick was trying to intimidate them as his demeanor was quite threatening. One of the volunteers stepped in between Rick and the other volunteer in a protective move as she was concerned about their physical safety.

The next day, after Trey had been reinstated to play in the Nationals, Rick approached the volunteers and apologised for his actions the previous day. They told him they accepted his apology as they felt it would be better to try to keep things as calm as possible so that there would be minimal impact on the junior team, they still had 4 days left of the tournament where they would need to interact so wanted to keep things as amicable as possible during this time. One of the volunteers did say to Rick that the issue would be dealt with at a later time.

Both volunteers reported back to Pool Vic that they would not be willing to volunteer in future in the same capacity due to the severity of abuse they had experienced from Rick

Resolution Presented:

- ➤ The Committee has by resolution suspended Rick Merlo from playing in the LVEBA for 8 months (for the remainder of the current Winter season and the upcoming Summer season of 2024/25);
- ➤ Rick will be eligible for membership renewal as of the 2025 AGM;
- ➤ A 12 month suspended sentence will be imposed following the suspension period. Any further issues relating to Rick's behaviour during the suspended sentence will result in a 12 month suspension of membership from the LVEBA;
- ➤ Rick will be ineligible for LVEBA representation for 3 years from Country Cup and Interleague;
- ➤ Rick will be ineligible for State Selection until January 2025.

Rick was now given the opportunity to present:

Rick firstly addressed the Statement provided by the volunteers stating that "It was an absolute Crock" and that it was the old school ground thing of he said, she said, It her word against mine and was no where near the extent that she claims! Rick proceeded to read out his version of how the events occurred.

Rick followed with an assessment of his general demeanor as Gruff which can be misinterpreted as combative by those who don't know him well and feels that this is what has occurred.

From there Rick went onto his reasoning as to what had led to the event and his version of the event at hand. He did state that he did approach and speak to the volunteers outside of the venue, he had supporting letter from team mates of Treys that he wanted to give them, the volunteers refused to accept them, Rick became frustrated and angry, then stated that if they had of just accepted the letters or answered his questions this wouldn't have happened, then went onto say at no time did he "Get in their face" and did not swear or threaten them and he did not get in their personal space and believes at no time was he within no less than 3 feet from them, they were up on the nature strip and he was on the road.

Rick also stated that the day after the event, he approached the volunteers again to apologise which he believed was accepted by the volunteers before continuing again around the lead up and justification of his actions.

Questions:

- Chris Johnson asked Rick if signed a contract from Pool Victoria to attend the Nationals with Trey.
 - o Rick responded not as far as he was aware Trey confirmed that thy did.
- ➤ Ken Krieger asked if Rick had received a certified letter from Pool Victoria
 - o Rick responded was No he did not, he received nothing from Pool Victoria
- Rosa Payne asked Rick how do we know that you're not telling the truth.
 - Rick responded with, a he said, she said scenario, it comes down to what you believe, I can only tell you my course of events. Again he confirmed that he did get angry, he understands, but believes that him questioning them was justified, and if they had have done things correctly there would not have been an issue, but because they refused to take the letters and refused to acknowledge that the did things against the constitution that he did get a bit angrier, and he apologises for that, but feels that it should be understandable.

- Angela Dean asked Rick if he believed could someone feel intimidated or feel threatened in situations that others may not have the same feelings.
 - Rick stated he didn't disagree, but if they had have just accepted the letters it wouldn't have gotten to that stage.
- ➤ Peter Simpson made a statement to Rick, regarding his actions, in particular his demeanour directed at the volunteers and didn't understand why Rick was appealing this current resolution. He made it very clear to Rick that the league have to action this and he believed Rick should swallow some pride and accept the punishment for the indiscretion.
- ➤ Ken Kreiger made a statement around Rick stating that he hadn't heard from Pool Victoria regarding their disciplinary meeting. Don Colbert (President of Pool Victoria) contacted Ken asking for clarification for Ricks number. Kenny gave Claires number to Don for contact. Ken stated that he spoke to Don a few weeks later and asked him if he was able to reach Rick where he was told that Rick did answer the call, but when he found out who it was, he no longer took the calls, so they sent out a certified letter to Rick.
 - Rick denied this happening, Rick went on to say "No Offensive Kenny, but either you or Don Colberts Full of shit!" because they never ever contacted me.
- > Trey Merlo then made a statement to Rick stating that he is trying to defend himself, but he is now yelling and being aggressive towards our own members.

Members were then asked to undertake their vote via secret ballot. Matt Sawyer setup across the other side of the room and called each member up one at a time.

Matt and Claire counted the votes

Claire announced to Rick and the members that the resolution passed with **more than 75%** of members voting to uphold the resolution

By-Law Changes: Special Business.

Ken Krieger asked about the members not given time to have input on the proposed changed. Andrew O'Neill said that this meeting was called mainly to discuss the Turks Bar issue and the Committee have added this in to address an issue with the Points System over the Winter Competition.

Special Business:

Special Business Received from the Committee: Special Resolution - By-Law Amendment.

Andrew O'Neill spoke about the issue that we have had this season and would like to address this by making a change to the points system. People have been talking about the group 3 and how big it is. There was an imbalance with a few teams getting more of an advantage than necessary. Teams had raised the issue with me and on the data that I do to check and see how things are going with the Points system you could clearly see that this was an issue. By reducing the group 3 to 30% and moving the left over 10% into the 2.5 group this should help alleviate the issue going forward and if this doesn't fix the issue, I will look at making the 2's the bigger group rather than the 2.5's.

Making these changes is to make the competition fairer and even for everyone. The Point System is still achieving what it set out to do and that was to create competition and you only have to look at the ladder throughout the season where there was little in it for nearly all the teams and making the final six was really tight. And another way I know that its working is that we have had a different team win it every season so far. So, at the moment we are doing some tinkering with it to get it in the ball park where we are happy with it. If anyone has any issue with the Point System going forward come and see me and I'm happy to discuss any issue with you, I run the data and have all the score cards and we can go through it all, I don't go off emotional feelings I go off the data and what it is telling me, so please stop complaining to other people and come to me if you have any issues.

Paul Stevenson asked about the turnout tonight and how disappointing it is. Andrew O'Neill said that it's pretty standard, it's been going on for years now, COVID didn't help either but the decline started happening before that. Rosa Payne added that it's always the same faces that we see at these meetings. Andrew O'Neill said considering the issue (Turks Bar) at this meeting its disappointing to see so few members here.

Other Business:

1. **Turks Bar:** After the Completion of the Summer Competition the venue will no longer be available for the Association to use going forward.

Claire Blackford explained how the rumours that are going round 'like is the league shutting down' and also that 'we were going to pull the finals' are not helpful, I've had the venue get in contact with me and I've had to explain to them that this was not the case. Claire Blackford went onto explain to the members what had happened.

- 1) Wednesday 21st August 2024: Letter/Message Turks Bar pulling sponsorship (\$500) not enough support from the league on Tuesday night, no meetings are ever held here, presentation booked then cancelled for another venue that does not sponsor. Other issues included table preparation and issues with good paying patrons wanting to play pool on a Tuesday night.
 - Claire Blackford said that we didn't know that this was coming and didn't know that they had issues, they had not spoken to us beforehand. Nothing was mentioned at the time about pulling the venue it was purely just the sponsorship. I sent a message back and asked for a meeting so that we could sit down and talk about it. Lyn replied that she was pretty sure that they have made up their mind but would have a talk to them when they got back from holidays about having a sit-down meeting.
- 2) Friday 30th August, 2024: Andrew O'Neill went up to Turks and arranged a meeting with the owners of Turks Bar. Andrew and I sat down with Lyn and Matt, Tracey did not attend. I started by saying that we have always had a great relationship with Turks and if there are any issues we would always like to sit down and discuss them with you regardless of any decisions made like sponsorship. Lyn then went over basically the same issues as outlined in the message.
 - Sponsorship
 - Presentation Night booking
 - No Meetings held at Turks Bar
 - Not making enough money on a Tuesday night
 - Other Patrons not been able to use the tables
 - Ongoing complaints to staff on Tuesday & Wednesday nights about the points system
 - A League member who was rude to Tracey on a Tuesday night
 - After completion of the Summer Competition Turks will be withdrawing their venue

- Turks Bar will be running their own competition on a Tuesday night
- We asked if there was anything we could do to change their minds. No, the decision has been made.

The Committee waited until the finals were done before bring this to a meeting so that there would be no issues with the completion of the Winter Competition season.

Claire Blackford said that we responded to all of the above issues and obversley the withdrawal of the venue was not in the message that was sent on the 21st August so, this was news to us and also the fact that they have decided to run their own competition on a Tuesday night.

Andrew O'Neill said that the main issue is that they are not making enough money on a Tuesday night and then not having the Presentation Night at Turks when it was apparently booked, although we were unaware of this at the time there seems to have been a mix up with booking.

Revenue: When it comes to making money in comparison the Wednesday Competition has more teams and they drink more because it's more of a social competition as on a Tuesday night, our members take it more seriously and so they don't drink as much. We use three tables one week and four on the other week, whereas the Wednesday night use all seven tables each week.

Presentation Night: There seems to have been a mix up at the start of the season as I gave them a copy of the calendar and they markup the diary and I think inadvertently the Presentation Night was booked and in hindsight I should have taken more notice of what was being booked, but I didn't even think of it at the time, but having said all that they didn't lose a booking. I believe they can hold 60 people in there and at our presentation night we had over 70 people going so, I don't believe we would have been able to hold the event at Turks Bar anyway.

Sponsorship: A further note about sponsorship we were not going to approach them for sponsorship this year as the previous owner had sponsorship owing in which Matt and Tracey honoured and we decided as a Committee not to ask for sponsorship this year and that had been forwarded onto them.

Communication: Has not been great with the venue of recent as the introduction of the membership was a good example and if they had of sat down with us and talked to us about this, we could have raised some of the issues that we could see happening that did and some of the issue that they have had could have been sorted out. And again, with this issue we were the ones who had to go to them and organise a meeting to try and work through the issues that they have. When were they going to tell us that the venue was no longer available after the Summer Competition if we had not pushed for a meeting? It seems to me that they don't want to discuss with us anything that's going on up there and that makes things really difficult.

The Committee and the Members discussed at length the issues outlined by Turks Bar with more explanation/informing to the members about the issues and what is to be done going forward.
